Responsibilities

Faculty must meet expectations of the role related to teaching, scholarship, and service in a research enhanced comprehensive university setting. Faculty are responsible for promoting the mission, vision, values and strategic goals of the University and the College of Nursing.

Requirements

The University of Wisconsin Oshkosh College of Nursing invites applicants for tenured or tenure track positions beginning in fall 2016. Successful candidates possess the ability to: (a) fulfill responsibilities of the faculty role including shared governance activities, (b) contribute to the advancement of nursing science through research and scholarship (c) teach and advise students, (d) participate in the development and evaluation of nursing curricula, and (e) engage in community and professional organizations and activities.

- Faculty candidates with research doctorate preparation are expected to present a
 robust research agenda. The candidate's program of research, educational
 background, role preparation, and rigor of the research agenda will be
 considered as well as the candidate's potential for scholarly growth. Candidates
 with research doctorates may or may not be APRNs or have medical-surgical
 experience but these qualifications are preferred.
- A PhD in a field related to nursing will be considered if the candidate has a master's in nursing and there is evidence of a rigorous research agenda.
- If the candidate is an APRN, he or she is eligible for a tenured or tenure track position if the candidate holds a research doctorate **or** DNP degree.
- Faculty with DNP preparation will be considered if they are eligible to teach in the DNP program or if they have strong medical-surgical experience.
- Recent graduates (last 3 years) with research doctorates or the DNP are expected to demonstrate evidence of manuscript submissions to peer-reviewed publications.
- Experienced faculty candidates (with a research doctorate or DNP) are expected
 to demonstrate evidence of a consistent record of *publications* in peer-reviewed
 publications.

Excellent communication, team building skills, and commitment to the core values of equity, diversity and inclusivity are required for all candidates.

Preferences

Applicants with teaching experiences at the baccalaureate or higher degree level (particularly in medical-surgical nursing or advanced practice) are preferred. Experience in advising doctoral students is ideal.

Tenure Track- Academic year (nine month) or annualized (12 month) appointments are possible depending on current need in the College. All positions require driving/travel.

Application Deadline

Consideration of applicants will continue until the deadline posted on uwosh.edu/hr website. Following this date, applicants will be placed into a secondary pool until the position is filled.

How to Apply

All faculty candidates:

Submit a letter of intent, vita, three current letters of recommendation, contact information for an additional 3 references and transcripts (original for highest degree; copies of all others).

For candidates with research doctorates who graduated in the last 3 years:

- One reference letter must be from a member of the candidate's dissertation committee.
- Submit syllabi or catalog descriptions of research courses taken while in the doctoral program and a copy of each manuscript submitted for publication
